The Department recommends that all homes should be tested for radon every 5 years. Radon is an odorless, colorless and tasteless gas that occurs naturally in the soil and can enter homes through cracks and openings in floors and walls. Two-in-Five homes have radon levels that could cause significant health risk, but it is preventable. Free test kits can be picked up at Land Services at 322 Laurel Street.
